The Deanery Synod will meet via Zoom this Tuesday (9 Feb).

Ash Wednesday—17 Feb

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, will be different this year. Please do try to join our Zoom Eucharist at 7pm. Further details to come soon.

Rhythm of Life Lent Groups

This is a standalone course that can serve as a stepping stone for further engagement with the Rhythm of Life. There will be six Zoom sessions, which will provide an opportunity to engage with the seven Rhythm of Life areas for deepening commitment: Praying, Reflecting, Encouraging, Sharing, Resting, Celebrating, Creating. Each session will be 90 minutes in length, including a 10 minute break. The framework will consist of video clips, Bible passages, discussion questions, and prayer. In line with demand, two weekly slots may be available in the parish: 10am Tuesday (from 23 Feb) and 7.30pm Thursday (from 18 Feb). There will also be a diocesan-wide course offered on Wednesdays at 7.30pm from 24 Feb.
